

HILLEL COMMUNITY DAY SCHOOL SUPPLY LIST 2009-10

We are so happy to include the supply list with Report Cards this year. Many back-to-school items were already spotted in Big Lots and Dollar Tree. We will send out an e-mail in late August letting you know when classrooms are ready, so you may bring supplies before the start of school.

Kindergarten, JS & GS - Mrs. Lisa Cottrell & Mrs. Jacqui Lipschitz

- 1 extra-large backpack or book bag to carry his/her belongings to and from school.
- 1 complete change of clothes, **labeled** (underpants, socks, shirts, pants/skirt, an extra sweatshirt or sweater, mittens or gloves) in case of need. Put everything in one shoebox and label with student name. We will send home reminders; however, please be mindful of the different clothes needed for the different seasons.
- Six (6) large boxes of tissues.
- Two (2) sets of headphones, (for computer class and classroom), **labeled** – please put in a ziploc bag
- Six large (.74 oz.) glue sticks (these are easier for little hands) – we may ask for replacements later in the year
- A dozen pencils, sharpened
- One package of eraser toppers.
- Two (2) 3-ring binders, 1” wide, each with 25, 3-hole pocket-style page protectors
- A pack of **washable** markers
- 1 small bottle hand sanitizer
- 1 package paper or plastic cups – at least 16
- 1 package plastic spoons and forks – at least 16
- 1 package of paper plates – at least 16 per pack

BOYS - Two (2) spare Kippot, **labeled**, and clips, if needed.

Grade 1, GS – Mrs. Jackie Buff (Room 19) & Mrs. Zippy Kleinberg (Room 18)

We are asking for duplicates of many items so supplies may stay in each classroom and need not be transported back and forth.

- 2 sets **washable** markers, primary colors - one GS, one JS
- 2 marker boxes, labeled with name – one GS, one JS
- 12 - #2 pencils, labeled with name – 6 for GS, 6 for JS
- 12 large glue sticks (.74 oz.) – 6 for GS, 6 for JS - we may ask for replacements later in the year
- 2 pair safety scissors - one GS, one JS
- 2 pencil boxes - one GS, one JS
- 2 erasers, labeled with name - one GS, one JS
- 6 boxes of tissues – 3 GS, 3 JS
- 2 folders, 1 blue, with 2 horizontal pockets and 3 brads in the middle for GS
- 1 laminated folder (so it is sturdier) with 2 horizontal pockets for GS
- 1 marbled composition notebook for GS
- 1 pair headphones for the computer room, **labeled** with name. Please put in a ziplock bag.
- 1 folder, any color, with two pockets for JS
- 1 package of crayons for JS
- 1 package paper or plastic cups – at least 16
- 1 package plastic spoons and forks – at least 16
- 1 package of paper plates – at least 16

- Razor point Sharpie markers, assorted colors
- 1 pair scissors
- 6 glue sticks – we may ask for replacements later in the year
- 1 package paper or plastic cups – at least 16 per pack
- 1 package plastic spoons and forks – at least 16 per pack
- 1 package of paper plates – at least 16 per pack

- 1 three-ring binder, 1”

- Eraser (can use those purchased for other grades/classes)
